
17XX Information Maneuver Occupational Field

1. The Information Warfighting Function

The information warfighting function is the 7th and newest warfighting function

The information warfighting function centers on the idea that Marines generate, preserve, deny, and project information to create and exploit information advantages as a means of accomplishing objectives as effectively as possible

Information advantage is an exploitable condition resulting from one actor's ability to generate, preserve, deny, or project information relative to another



2. 17XX Professionalization

Development of an all-inclusive 17XX Information Maneuver Occupational Field supports a force capable of effective operations in the Information Environment and enabling information as the 7th Warfighting Function.

OIE capabilities are in high demand by the Joint Force and necessary for future Stand-in Forces to compete and win.

17XX Professionalization will transition existing structure of multiple FMOSs to create four new Primary MOSs in the Occupational Field – see slide 3 "What's New with 17XX" for additional information





What's New With 17XX and Way Forward

PMOS: 1706 Maritime Space Officer

MOS Description: Maritime Space Officers (MSO) serve as the Commander's principal space operations advisor for integration of space effects and capabilities into Fleet Marine Force (FMF) operations. They evaluate both friendly and adversary capabilities; and develop, coordinate, and execute approved offensive and defensive space control activities.

17XX capabilities/responsibilities: MSOs are responsible for the deliberate, detailed planning and employment of space capabilities and effects, as well as the coordination and integration of a unit's space efforts into its overall scheme of maneuver.

Purpose/responsibilities/purview of new MOS: Marines serving in 0540 billets were conducting space operations duties for one tour before returning to their primary MOS, leading to very limited long-term space operations expertise. 1706 replaces key 0540 billets throughout the Fleet, and compliments and augments the efforts of 8866 (Space Operations Officers) who are employed above the tactical level. Professionalizing space creates long-term investment opportunities for the community.

Assigned to types of units: MIGs, MEUs, MARFORSPACE, USSF, and other USMC, Joint, and IC organizations

PMOS: 1707 Influence Officer

MOS Description: Influence Officers are trained personnel who primarily plan and conduct MISO, conduct civil authorities' information support (CAIS) and civil affairs operations (CAO). MISO are planned operations to convey selected information and indicators to foreign audiences to influence their emotions, motives, objective reasoning, and, ultimately, the behavior of foreign governments, organizations, groups, and individuals in a manner favorable to the originator's objectives.

17XX capabilities/responsibilities: Influence Officers formulate plans and policies and coordinate and supervise functions pertaining to military information support operations

Purpose/responsibilities/purview of new MOS: Previously the 0520 was a FMOS filled by Officers who would be sent to the required training, fill the duties of their tour, and rotate back to their previous MOS. The 1707 PMOS replaces the 0520, reducing the turn around of Officers in training and creating a long-term investment for the community.

Assigned to types of units: I MIG, II MIG, III MIG, MCIOC, Infantry Battalions, MFP, MFE/A, and a variety of other units

PMOS: 1751 Influence Specialist

MOS Description: Influence Operators plan and execute functions pertaining to military information support operations (MISO), civil authorities' information support (CAIS), and civil affairs operations (CAO). MISO are planned operations to convey selected information and indicators to foreign audiences to influence their emotions, motives, objective reasoning, and, ultimately, the behavior of foreign governments, organizations, groups, and individuals in a manner favorable to the originator's objectives.

17XX capabilities/responsibilities: Influence Operators capabilities are critical to the success of the Fleet Marine Force (FMF) mission, as they enable commanders to shape the information and security environment in their areas of responsibility (AOR).

Purpose/responsibilities/purview of new MOS: The 0521 PMOS is converting to 1751 PMOS with the addition of the Civil Affairs training requirement. The Marines will attend training at MCCMOS to create a rounded Marine to answer all aspects of influence.

Assigned to types of units: I MIG, II MIG, III MIG, MCIOC, Infantry Battalions, MFP, MFE/A, and a variety of other units
